SCOTS IN THE BUSH – Additional Information

WEDNESDAY EVENING: Joins us for our sausage sizzle fundraiser from 6pm with proceeds this year going to RACQ Life Flight. We will also be conducting a sound check around the same time.

FIRES: Fires are allowed but must be in a container and placed above the ground. Ashes **MUST BE PLACED IN THE ASH DRUMS LOCATED THROUGHOUT THE CAMPING AREA.** If there is a total fire ban called, no fires will be allowed. Please do not allow smoke from your fire to annoy your neighbours.

MENU NOTICES: Menu notices will be displayed outside the kitchen area and there will be different menus on some days. **CASH IS REQUIRED FOR ALL MEALS FROM THE KITCHEN AND THE BAR.**

CAMP OVEN MEALS: Camp oven meals will be available on Friday and Saturday evenings. Tickets will be presold for Camp Oven meals. Times of the ticket sales and camp oven meals times will be displayed and announced from the stage. Ticket holders are to line up at the advertised time as the meal will be served on time.

MINI HIGHLAND GAMES PARTICIPANTS: Those wishing to participate in the mini highland games must register at the registration desk. All **MUST** complete and sign an exemption/disclaimer form.

SEATING IN THE BIG TOP: **There is no reserved seating.** Please do not place cushions, rugs or coats on seating and leave it for more than 45 minutes and expect it to be there when you return. Do not leave items on seats for whole sessions. It is OK to place a cushion on the seat and leave it for a short while when you go to collect a meal or go to the bathroom.

WALK UP PERFORMERS: Those wishing to perform on the Wednesday Evening and/or Thursday morning must register their participation with the Comperes, Merv Webster or Clarrie Weller. They will be located behind the stage at the back of the Big Top.

PIPERS AND DRUMMERS UNITE: This is an invitation to all pipers and drummers to group together at the marshalling point adjacent to Brownie's Hut. They will then march into the Big Top towards the stage, form a circle and do a short presentation. This will herald the beginning of a session.

CHURCH SERVICE/KIRKIN' O' THE TARTAN: The service will take place in the gardens commencing at 8.00 am Sunday. The service will be conducted by Pastor Bal Sami from The Wondai - Proston Baptist Church. The Kirkin' o' the Tartan will be incorporated into the service.
